Hillsdale Academy Mission Statement

Hillsdale Academy, located on the campus of and under the direction of Hillsdale College, is a private, K-12, classical, Christian school. It develops within its students the intellectual and personal habits and skills upon which responsible, independent, and productive lives are built, in the firm belief that such lives are the basis of a free and just society.

The Academy strives to offer enrichment and to develop character through both curricular and extracurricular offerings, to nurture the child's humanity—spirit, mind and body—with a constant view to the potential adult. The time-honored liberal arts curriculum and pedagogy direct student achievement toward mastery of the basics, exploration of the arts and sciences, and understanding of the foundational tenets of our Judeo-Christian and Greco-Roman heritage.

The curriculum, by purpose and design, is a survey of the best spiritual, intellectual, and cultural traditions of the West as they have been developed and refined over countless generations.

Upper School Curriculum

<u>Overview</u>

• Core college-preparatory classical course of study for all students includes Latin, literature, science, mathematics, and history every year

- Study of Latin begins in third grade; transfer students begin when they enroll
- Electives offered in languages, fine arts, computer science, and physical education

Graduation Requirements

• Senior year requires two 10- to 15-page capstone projects: one research-based science inquiry; and one humanities project requiring an engagement with the history of ideas

• Passing grade required for year in Algebra 2, Latin 2, and both capstone projects

• No minimum graduation credit requirement: transcript credits are figured on the number of hours a week a class meets divided by 3 trimesters. Core classes are 1.67 credits per trimester (5x/wk ÷ 3); one hour/wk electives earn 0.33 credits per trimester

Dual enrollment @ Hillsdale College

- Open to juniors and seniors in good standing who take core academic courses
- Grades generate a separate transcript that is not incorporated into the Hillsdale Academy transcript

Advanced Placement

• Academy courses are not part of AP Course Audit and are not called "AP" on transcripts

• Students are welcome to take any AP test; no AP test is required of any student

• From 2018-2022, 71% of Academy AP test-takers scored a three or better on AP exams

Covid Response

• Pass/fail grades were given only for the trimester term March-June 2020 when Michigan mandated online learning for all schools

• Classes have met in-person 5 days a week since fall 2020; regular grading scale is maintained

Student Life

Athletics: Varsity sports: soccer, volleyball, basketball, track and field, cross country, and golf. Club: clay target shooting team. Memberships: MHSAA, SCAA conference, Independent Soccer League. Varsity teams collectively have won 91 conference titles, 31 district titles, 18 regional titles, and 6 state titles. Ninety-one individual athletes have earned All-State honors, while 67 have earned Academic All-State awards. Forty-eight alumni have competed in NAIA or NCAA Division I, II, and III programs. In 2021 the boys cross country team won the MHSAA Division 4 Team State Championship. **Clubs:** Student Council coordinates campus social activities. Quiz Bowl teams, National Honor Society, a pro-life club, a chess club, and a voluntary service club meet throughout the school year.

Fine Arts: Ensembles: chamber choir, orchestra, drama. Advanced musicians may participate in the Hillsdale College Orchestra. All freshmen and sophomores take art and music weekly. Electives: music theory, drama, advanced art. Past productions include *Guys and Dolls, The Music Man, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Fiddler on the Roof, The Tempest, Twelfth Night*, and *Oklahoma!* Both *The Crucible* and the musical *Matilda* will be presented in 2022-23.
